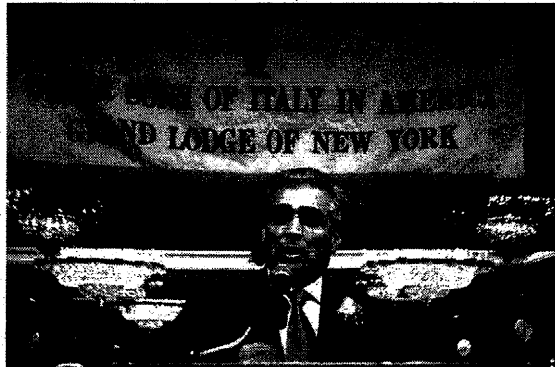


COMMISSION FOR SOCIAL JUSTICE

MESSAGE FROM CSJ CHAIRMAN JOHN FRATTA



My Brothers and Sisters:

Let me say without hesitation, that it is an honor for me to serve as the new Chairman of the New York State Commission for Social Justice. I hope to follow in the great footsteps of those that came before me. Our job is a formidable one, and

we have many issues that we face that need to be addressed and corrected. Although we will deal with these issues as they come, we will always be mindful of an important aspect of the CSJ, promoting a positive image of Italian-Americans.

Columbus Day

One of the most pressing issues facing the Italian-American community today is the attack on Christopher Columbus and those pushing to have Columbus Day removed from the calendar. This month, we were notified that the City Council of Los Angeles would be taking up a measure, voted by a committee, to remove Columbus Day and replace it with Indigenous People's Day. This issue seems to be snowballing all over our country. We, in New York, under the leadership of Brother Louis Gallo have been successful in preventing Columbus Day to be removed from the calendar in several parts of New York State. I congratulate Brother Lou and thank him for these victories. My brothers and sisters, we have to take this fight head on, with vigor and a resolve to be victorious. We cannot allow those that speak the loudest, and those elected officials that respond to them, to be able to take away this one day that Italian-Americans have to highlight our culture and heritage.

We also, cannot allow those that want to rewrite history in order to be politically acceptable, to now make Christopher Columbus a villain, instead of the hero that he has been the last 500 years. We, as Italians and Italian-Americans, have to come together to have our voices heard loud and clear, that we will not accept these attacks on Christopher Columbus Day and on our Italian heritage to continue. We need to join forces with all Italian-American groups in this country, as well as, other ethnic groups to fight this attack. One such group that I am trying to reach out to is the leadership in the Latino community. As many of you know, the day before we celebrate Columbus Day there is a march up Fifth Avenue by the Hispanic community celebrating Columbus Day. I am reaching out to those leaders to join us.

I understand the need for the Native American community to have their day to show their great achievements and culture. I support that, as I am sure many of you do. There are 365 days in the year, and I am urging the Native American community to find another day to honor their culture and heritage. My brothers and sisters, if you have not already done so, I am urging you to sign the petition to SAVE COLUMBUS DAY. We have more than 7000 members in New York OSIA, and we need over 7000 signatures to be added from New York State. Please don't wait for someone else to do this. Saturday Night Live

The attack on the Italian-American community continues in the media and on TV. In a segment of Saturday Night Live, a skit was performed purporting to be in a lower eastside tenement. In that script, Italians were called greasy Italians, grease balls, filthy Italians among other smears. It was the most disgusting attack on us ever seen on TV. To think that they could get away with that, is part of the problem that we have as Italian-Americans. Any other group would be storming NBC and Saturday Night Live demanding a full apology, and demanding that SNL be taken off the air.

Board member Marianne Bortone Prince has drafted a strong letter under my signature that has been sent to all the advertisers of Saturday Night Live demanding that they pull their sponsorship of the show. This is not comedy – it is a vicious attack on us. We have also scheduled a meeting with the leadership of the Polish community, who were also attacked in this segment. We will be joining forces in this fight, and will continue to voice our objections to both NBC and the sponsors of the show until we get the proper respect and apology.

Linda Stasi Article

In Linda Stasi's column in the Daily News on June 18th, she compared Donald Trump to a mobster. I'm not getting involved in the politics of the article because that has no bearing on the issue. However, in the article, Linda Stasi used words such as mob and omerta, and having a picture of President Trump hanging on puppet strings, as in the Godfather in describing the Trump administration. There was no reason for her to use words that are associated with Italian organized crime. I was surprised and angry with that, and drafted a letter to her letting her know my feelings, and urging her to understand how those words continue to promote a negative stereotype of Italian-Americans.
